- 1. Prayer and renewal of the Religious life.
- Reconciliation within the church, ecumenically and the church in its local communities and further afield.
- 3. Evangelism.

Do come and take a look and pray. And if you sense anything that you would like to share please do write in the book that will be travelling with the prayer space so that we might discern what God is saying to us as a diocese and in the communities in which we live.

You may remember that Bishop Lee was preparing to cycle from John O Groats to Land's End when he was diagnosed and treated for Hodgkin Lymphoma. Following his recovery this was rescheduled and is now about to commence.

From 6-19 July the Bishop will be cycling the JOGLE (or 'Le Tour de Lee' as Chris Dobson has named it) in order to raise funds for our Diocese's work with our partners in Uganda. He has set an ambitious target of £10 000 and would love you to participate in this by prayer, by giving, or even by joining him for part of the ride on 16 July.
